It has been satisfying to be among the cohort of researchers who have studied the legal system, especially trial juries, from a psychological perspective. Like other social scientists, I believed-perhaps arrogantly-that the results of our research efforts could be used to make trial juries operate with more efficiency, accuracy, and satisfaction.
